"The cocoa beans arrive here in big bags," Ms. Özdemir explains. "They are very heavy, so they can only be moved with forklifts."

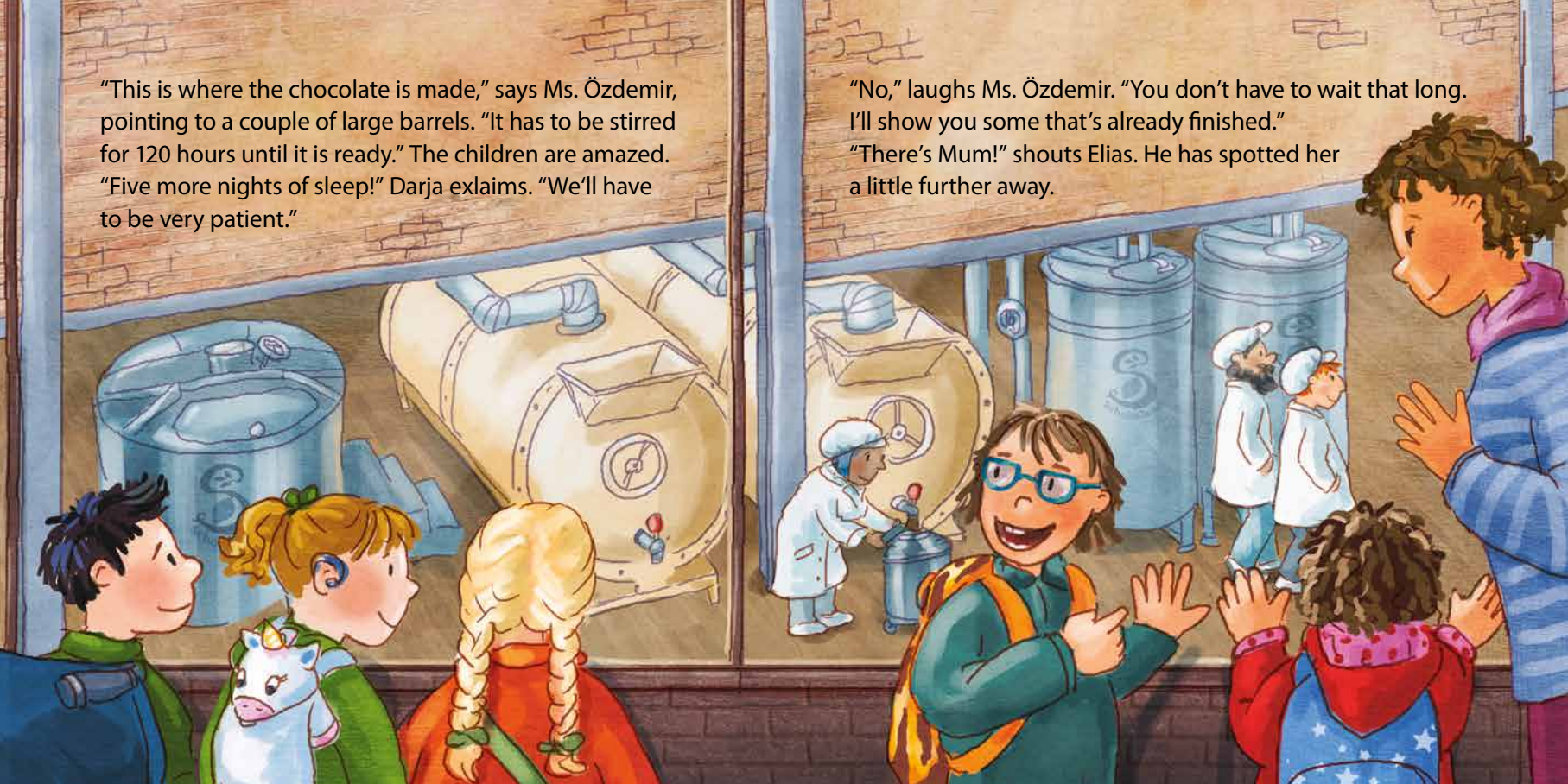
"I'd like to drive a forklift like that one day!" Maria exclaims enthusiastically.

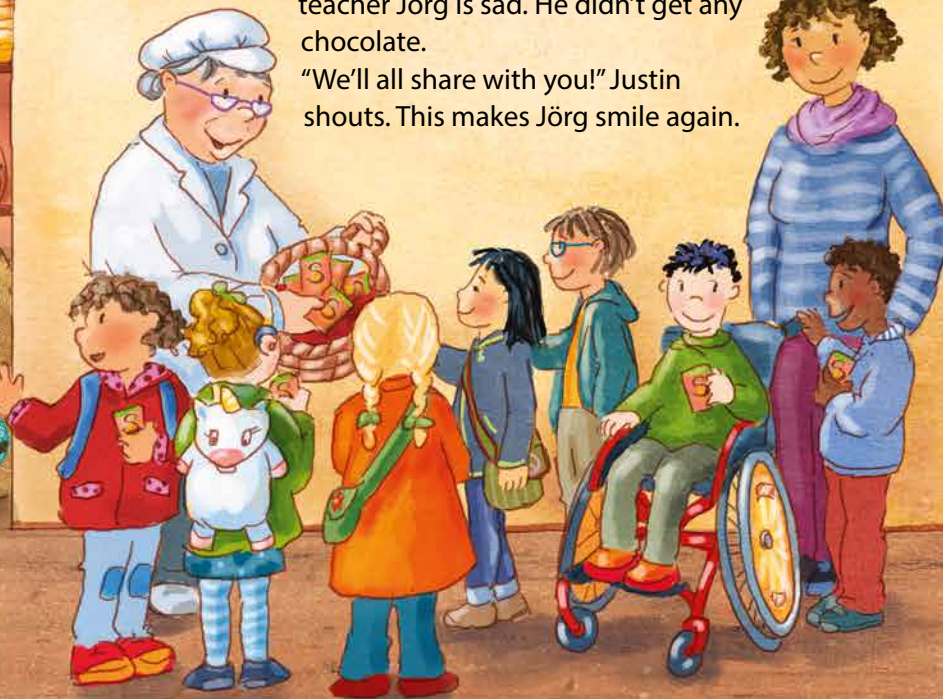

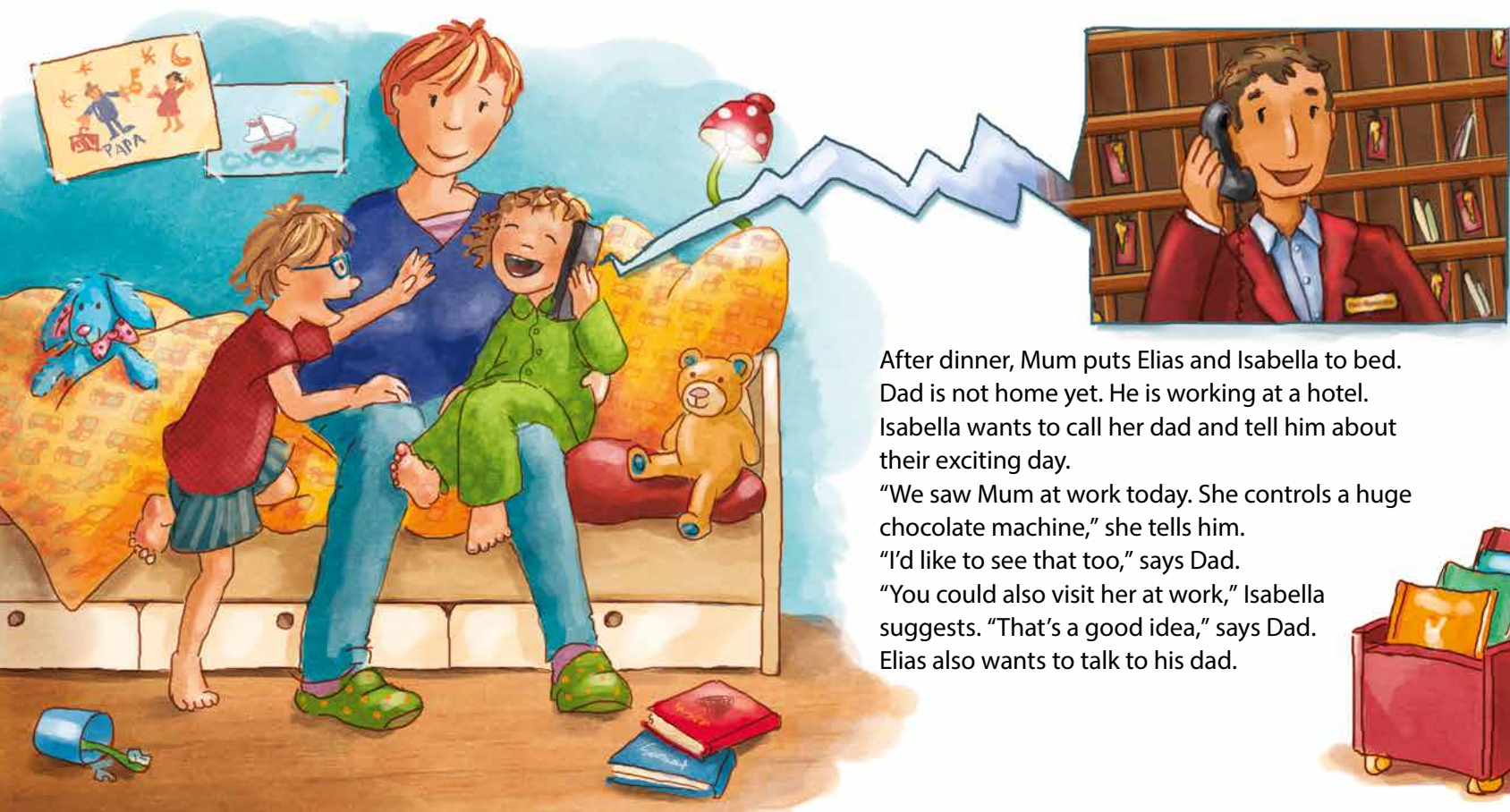
